Maryland, and Judge of the Land Office;

The petition of John Hoye, of Allegany County, humbly  
sheweth, That Jacob Horn, of Allegany County, had surveyed  
and laid out for him a tract or parcel of land called "Millsto-  
ne Hill," lying in the County aforesaid, and containing forty  
four and a quarter acres, by virtue of an assignment of five  
acres, part of a Common Warrant for twenty six and a half acres,  
obtained by Cornelius Gary, the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March, 1807, as appe-  
ars, - That he fully compounded for said land according  
to Law, and William H. Dawson, late Sheriff of Allegany  
County, has since exposed the same to public sale, when ~~John~~  
William McMahon became the purchaser and fully paid  
the purchase money for the same, - That said land has  
since been sold by the Sheriff of Allegany County, (with other  
lands as the property of William McMahon) to your petiti-  
-oner, who has also fully paid the purchase money for  
the same, - he therefore prays that patent may issue to  
him for the same; - and he will pray, &c.

By virtue of an Assignment of five Aers part of a Common Warrant for twenty six and a half Aers. granted out of the Land Office for the Western Shore to Cornelius Geary of Allegany County bearing date the second day of March eighteen hundred and seven, and by him assigned to Jacob Horn of Somerset County in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania on the second day of May eighteen hundred and seven.

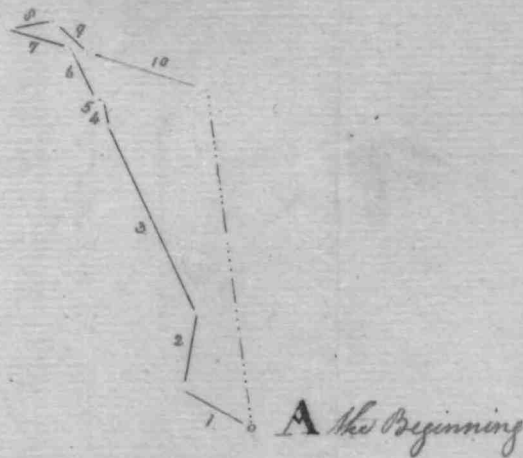
I therefore certify as Surveyor of Allegany County that I have carefully surveyed for and in the name of him the said Jacob. Horn all that tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid Beginning at two Gum saplings marked with six notches each, standing about one perch west from the South fork of "Millstone Run" a branch of "Ferns Run" that empties into "Wells Creek" and near the head of said Run and running thence North sixty degrees West forty perches, North twenty five degrees West one hundred and eight perches, North ten degrees West fourteen perches, North eighty degrees West four perches, North twenty five degrees West thirty perches, North seventy three degrees West thirty five perches, North eighty one degrees East twenty five perches, South forty seven degrees East twenty four, South seventy two degrees East forty five perches, then by a straight line to the Beginning containing forty four and a half Aers, to be held by the name of Millstone Hill, Surveyed May the twenty seven the Eighteen hundred and seven
